(**FAFSA**, **WAFSA**, **Washington State Financial Aid Resources**, etc.)

A pop-up window will appear with various questions for the student to answer regarding the FAFSA information. There are fifteen questions to complete. The tracking bar at the bottom will turn green as you progress.
