Purpose

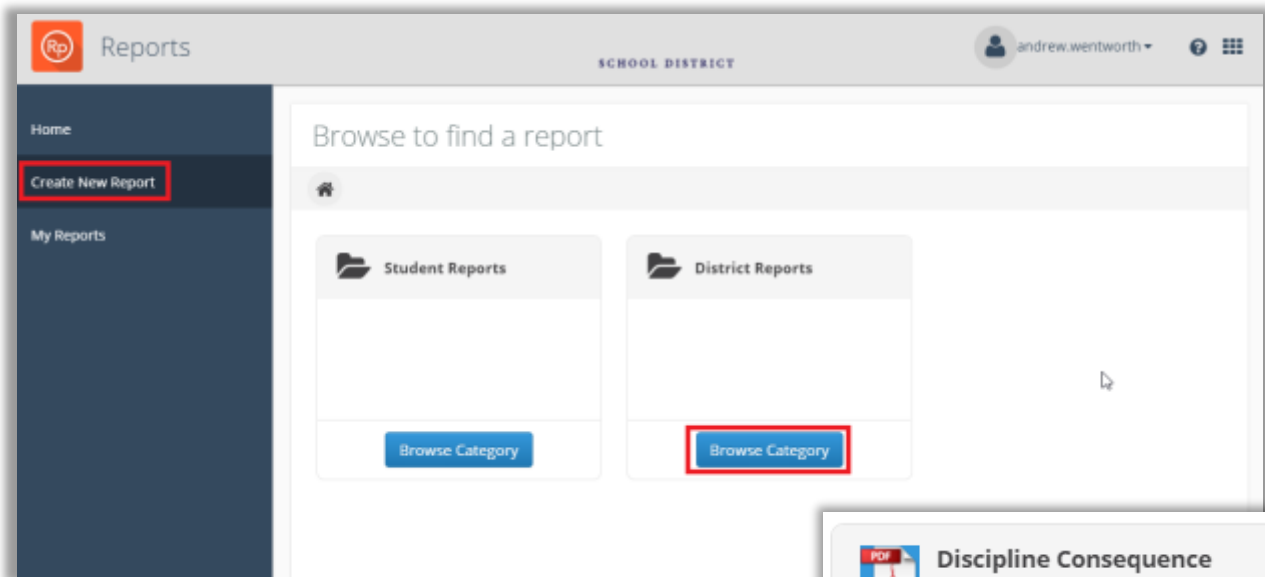
The Discipline Consequence Proportionality Report is designed to enable district staff to examine student sub-groups with Expulsions or Out of School Suspensions in comparison to their representation in the overall student population and the number of discipline incidents resulting in Expulsions or Out of School Suspensions.

Administrators can create a Discipline Consequence Proportionality Report for one or more sub-groups including gender and federal race code and can download the detail data for validation.

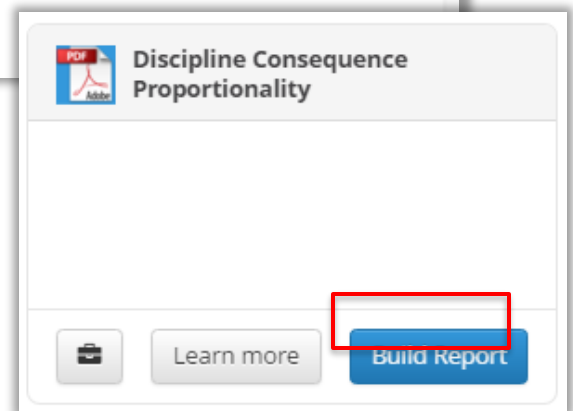
Running the report

From Homeroom, click on the grid in the top right corner of the screen and click the Reports Application icon.

The Composition Index at a glance:

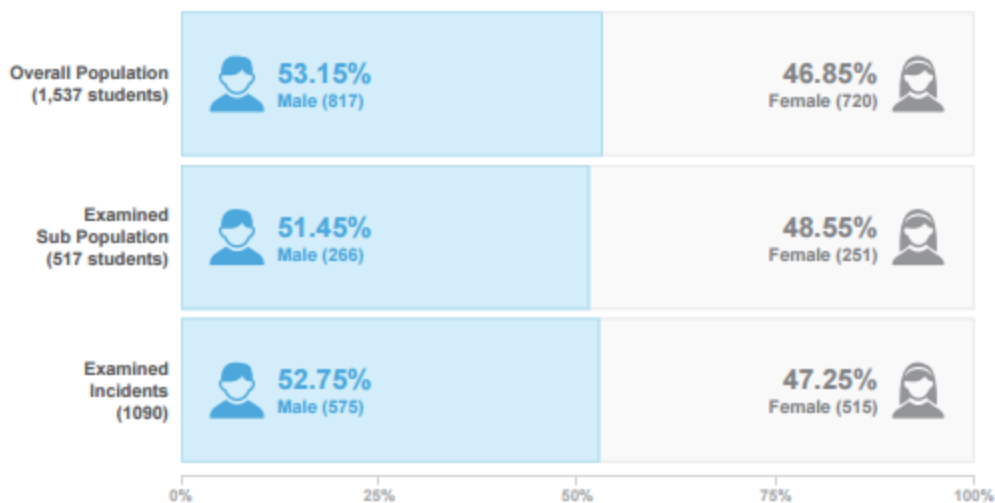
Numbers greater than one indicate the group makes up more of the examined sub-group than their representation in the overall population. Numbers less than one indicate the group makes up less of the examined sub-group than their representation in the overall population. When the percentages are equal, the composition index equals 1. This is considered an equitable rate.

Detail of Examined Sub-Population

Proportionality of Male

In 2015/16, the overall population of students enrolled in SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL in the 12th Grade, 11th Grade, 10th Grade, and 9th Grade, was 1,537. Of the 1,537 students in the overall population, 817 of them (53.15%) were Male.



In 2015/16, the count of students in the examined sub-population, who have at least one discipline incident consequence of Expulsion or Out of School Suspension in SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL in the 12th Grade, 11th Grade, 10th Grade, and 9th Grade, was 517. Of the 517 students, for whom discipline incident consequences of Expulsion or Out of School Suspension were recorded, 266 of them (51.45%) were Male.

In 2015/16, the count of discipline incidents that resulted in Suspensions/Expulsions in SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL in the 12th Grade, 11th Grade, 10th Grade, and 9th Grade, was 1,090. Of the 1090 discipline incidents resulting in Suspensions/Expulsions, 575 of them (52.75%) were recorded for Male Students

Composite Index

0.97 Mild	Male Students compose 53.15% of the overall population, but only 51.45% of the examined sub-population. Therefore they are mildly under-represented, with a composition index of $(51.45\% / 53.15\%)$ 0.97
0.99 Mild	Male Students compose 53.15% of the overall population, and they account for 52.75% of the discipline incidents that result in Suspensions/Expulsions. Therefore they are mildly under-represented with a composition index of $(52.75\% / 53.15\%)$ 0.99
