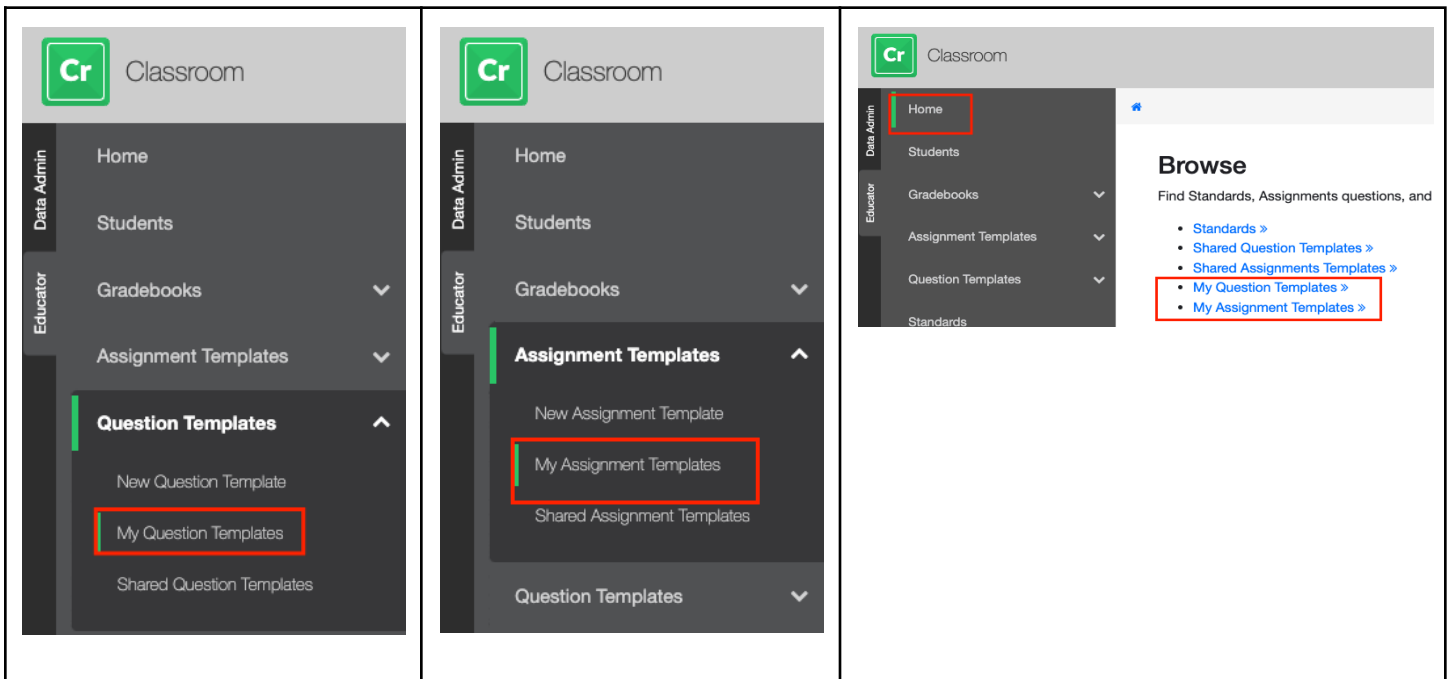


## My Question and My Assignment Templates




1. Start under **My Question Templates** or **My Assignment Templates** in the left navigation, or select the Browse section and choose **My Question Templates** or **My Assignment Templates**.



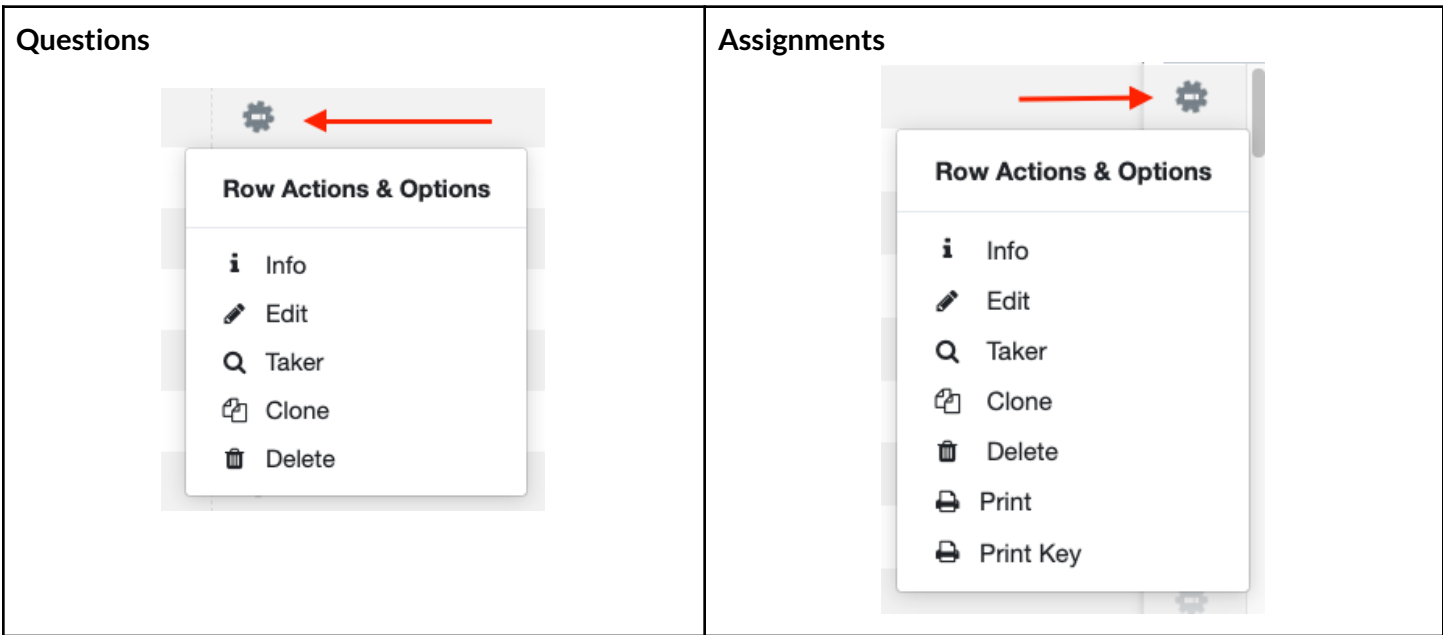
2. You will see a list of questions or assignments you created. Only you have access to these unless you choose to share them.
3. If filters are not visible, click the **Filter Actions Gear** to the far right, then select **Filter Display Mode** and/or **Available Filter**. Use filter options to locate templates by:
  - Keyword Search
  - Grade Level
  - Subjects
  - Assignment Question Types
  - Standards
  - Difficulty Levels
  - Complexity
  - Knowledge Types
  - Depth of Knowledge
  - Standard's Unique Code

**Note:** Selecting too many filters may yield no results. For best outcomes, filter by a single grade level, subject, or keyword.

4. Click the question or assignment or the magnifying glass to view details.
5. Click the “X” next to the search box, or choose Select None or Reset to clear filters.
6. Alternately, click the **Filter Actions Gear** and choose **Hidden**.

7. Click the **Row Actions Gear** to the far right to view available options.
  - **Information:** View details about the question or assignment
  - **Edit:** Modify a question or assignment.
  - **Taker:** View how a student would view the question or assignment online. The correct answer will be highlighted in green for multiple-choice and true/false questions.
  - **Clone:** Create a copy of a question or assignment.
  - **Delete:** Remove a question or assignment.
  - **Print:** (assignments only) Print assignments.
  - **Print Key: (assignments only)** Print only the Answer Key.
