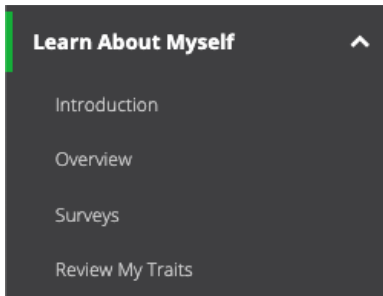

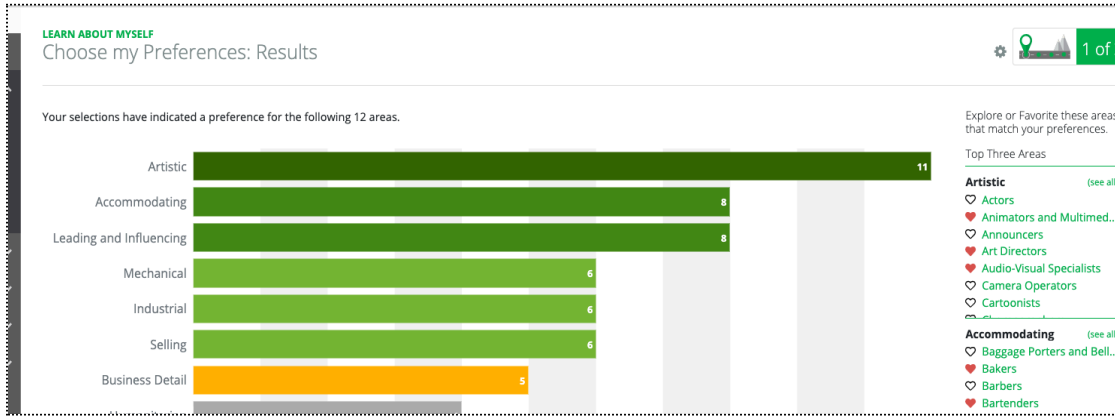

Career Cluster - Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources

Are science classes your favorite? Are you interested in protecting the environment? Do you collect rocks? Do you enjoy working outdoors? Do you enjoy working with animals? Do you have a green thumb? If so, this career cluster might be for you.

If you choose to work in occupations in the Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources cluster, you could raise plants and animals as sources for food and shelter. On the other hand, you could focus on selling and making products from plants and animals. These products include food, lumber, and fabrics. You might also provide advice and services that farmers and ranchers need to improve products. Another option in this cluster is to work to conserve natural resources and protect the environment.

Occupational Personality Types

 <p>Artistic - The "Creators"</p> <p>People with Artistic interests like work activities that deal with the artistic side of things, such as forms, designs and patterns. They like self-expression in their work. They prefer settings where work can be done without following a clear set of rules.</p> <p>EXAMPLE CAREERS Actors, Animators and Multimedia Artists, Architects</p>	 <p>Conventional - The "Organizers"</p> <p>People with Conventional interests like work activities that follow set procedures and routines. They prefer working with data and detail more than with ideas. They prefer work in which there are precise standards rather than work in which you have to judge things by yourself. These people like working where the lines of authority are clear.</p> <p>EXAMPLE CAREERS Accountants and Auditors, Actuaries, Archivists</p>	 <p>Enterprising - The "Persuaders"</p> <p>People with Enterprising interests like work activities that have to do with starting up and carrying out projects, especially business ventures. They like persuading and leading people and making decisions. They like taking risks for profit. These people prefer action rather than thought.</p> <p>EXAMPLE CAREERS Administrative Services Managers, Advertising Managers, Advertising Salespeople</p>
 <p>Investigative - The "Thinkers"</p> <p>People with Investigative interests like work activities that have to do with ideas and thinking more than with physical activity. They like to search for facts and figure out problems mentally rather than to persuade or lead people.</p> <p>EXAMPLE CAREERS Aerospace Engineers, Agricultural Engineers, Agricultural Scientists</p>	 <p>Realistic - The "Do-ers"</p> <p>People with Realistic interests like work activities that include practical, hands-on problems and solutions. They enjoy dealing with plants, animals and real-world materials, like wood, tools and machinery. They enjoy outside work. Often people with Realistic interests do not like occupations that mainly involve doing paperwork or working closely with others.</p> <p>EXAMPLE CAREERS Agricultural Inspectors, Agricultural Products Graders and Sorters, Aircraft Mechanics</p>	 <p>Social - The "Helpers"</p> <p>People with Social interests like work activities that assist others and promote learning and personal development. They prefer to communicate more than to work with objects, machines or data. They like to teach, to give advice, to help or otherwise be of service to people.</p> <p>EXAMPLE CAREERS Acupuncturists, Addictions Counselors, Adult and Vocational Education Teachers</p>

Environmental engineering technicians work with environmental engineers and scientists. They help prevent, control, and clean up pollution. Technicians follow plans developed by environmental engineers. Sometimes they work in the field collecting soil, air and water samples. Other times they work in laboratories preparing samples. They conduct tests and keep detailed records of results and observations.



Compositions

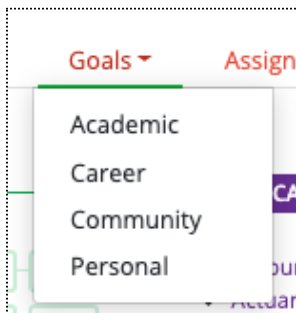
