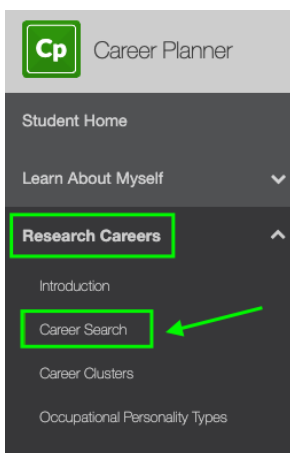
Career Research helps you explore various careers that best fit your interests and abilities. Of course, you want to work in a career where you are happy to go to work, so career research helps you know everything about careers. What will you do every day? How much does it pay? What is the training required? Will there be jobs in the future? Who hires people for these jobs? These are important factors to consider when making decisions about your future.

### Career Search

Career Search is a versatile tool that enables you to quickly search for careers.



## Searching and Sorting


You can type all or part of a word in any search box to find a list of matching careers. In the example below, typing "nurse" in the Career Search box returns all careers that include "nurse" in their name. Note that "Nursery Workers" is included because "nurse" is part of the name.



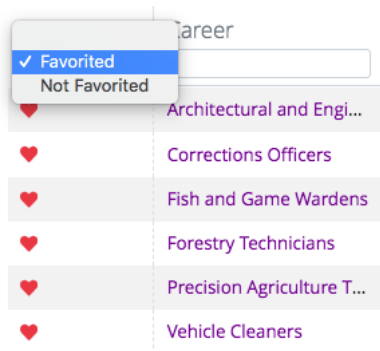

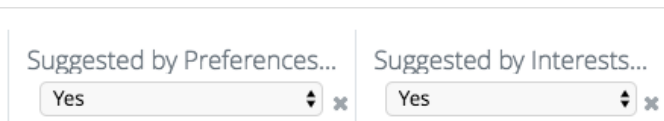

For example, if you want to view only the careers you've favorited in other parts of Career Planner, toggle the heart column filter to "Favorited."



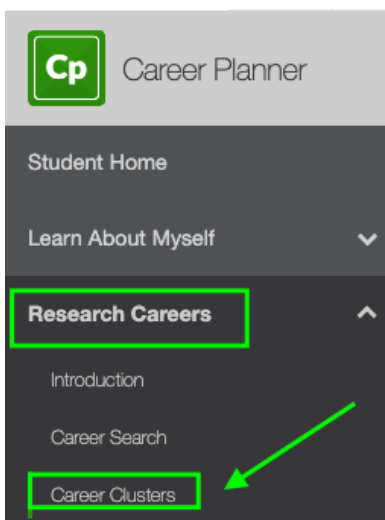

## Career Clusters

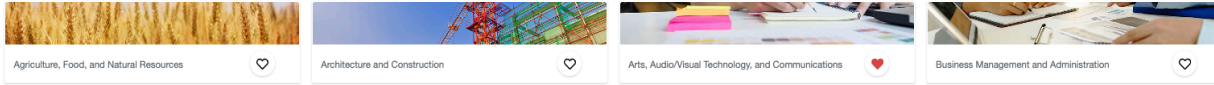
Career Clusters breaks down all careers in Career Planner into sixteen (16) career fields or clusters. If you are just starting your career research, this is an excellent place to begin; you will learn the basics of each job type, the education and training you can expect to invest, and compare wages for specific jobs in that field.

Remember to favorite careers you discover along the way!



Each Career Cluster has its page; click on any picture for a closer look at that cluster.

Use Career Clusters to find careers that share similar knowledge and skills. Each cluster contains several pathways. A pathway is a group of related career specialties within a cluster. Looking at Careers by Cluster provides you with a good starting point in your career research by showing careers you may not have thought about before and giving you quick information about those related careers.



Each **Career Cluster** page provides a brief description of why the field might appeal to you and summarizes the career paths available in that field. You can also hop straight to a list of all careers in that cluster. You can do this by clicking the link under the picture at the top right of the screen ("see all careers in this cluster").

♥ Career Cluster - Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources

Are science classes your favorite? Are you interested in protecting the environment? Do you collect rocks? Do you enjoy working outdoors? Do you enjoy working with animals? Do you have a green thumb? If so, this career cluster might be for you.

If you choose to work in occupations in the Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources cluster, you could raise plants and animals as sources for food and shelter. On the other hand, you could focus on selling and making products from plants and animals. These products include food, lumber, and fabrics. You might also provide advice and services that farmers and ranchers need to improve products. Another option in this cluster is to work to conserve natural resources and protect the environment.

## Career Pathways

There are a lot of careers out there, and even within a single Career Cluster, you can see plenty of variety.

Career Pathways further breaks down a Career Cluster to help you better understand your options in that field. Each pathway has its summary and list of careers. To see a **complete list** of careers for a pathway, click the **(see all careers)** link.

**CAREER CLUSTER PATHWAYS**

<b>Agribusiness Systems</b>	In the Agribusiness Systems pathway, you would focus on products or services. This includes food, fiber, wood products, natural resources, horticulture, and other plant and animal products or services. You might use satellite systems, computer databases and spreadsheets, or biotechnology to increase efficiency and profitability.	Farmers and Farm Managers
<b>Animal Systems</b>	In the Animal Systems pathway, you would strive to find better ways to produce and process meat, eggs, and dairy products. You might study the genetics, nutrition, or development of animals. On the other hand, you might purchase livestock from farmers and ranchers or assist them with marketing or selling their animals. To assure that the products are safe to eat, you could inspect and grade meat. To assist farmers and ranchers, you could advise them on how to feed or house their animals to increase production. Another option is to care for the animals. You might train, feed and water, groom, or exercise the animals. You may also clean, disinfect, and repair their cages.	Animal Breeders Animal Caretakers Animal Scientists (see all careers)
<b>Environmental Service Systems</b>	In the Environmental Service Systems pathway, you would act to protect the environment. You might focus on pollution control, recycling, waste disposal, or public health issues. Your work could involve doing studies to find threats to the ecosystem. Then you would figure out how to deal with the threats and to prevent future problems. You might design and operate wastewater systems. In other occupations in this pathway, you could collect, recycle, and remove hazardous materials. **Wages** will provide you with two columns containing dollar amounts. The first column displays the National Annual Median Wage for each career, and the second column shows the Washington Annual Median Wage.

The **National Annual Median Wage** indicates the average annual earnings of a worker in the United States after several years in a particular career. One way to think of it is "about 50% of workers earn this much or more yearly."

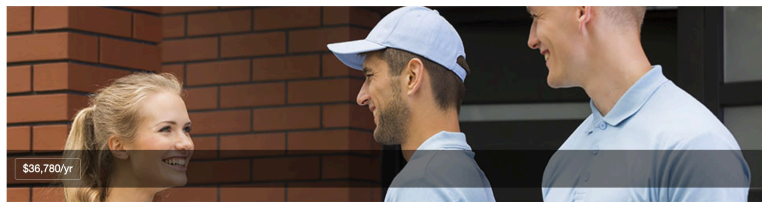
**Washington's Annual Median Wage** is similar to the National Annual Median Wage, except it only considers workers in Washington State. It is worth noting that while you may earn more money in certain locations, the cost of living in those areas can be higher.

 Couriers and Messengers



**Career Summary**  
 Couriers and messengers pick up and deliver letters, documents, and packages. Couriers and messengers typically work in cities and small local regions. They are used when overnight mail service is not fast enough. They are also used when electronic methods of delivery are not practical.

Dig Deeper

Digging Deeper will provide you with a variety of tabs for additional information. These sections summarize the education and training expectations for the field and break them down:

- **Duties** (Tasks, Common Work Activities),
- **Requirements** (Working Conditions, Physical Demands, Skills and Abilities),
- **Training** (Degrees, Certificates, Licenses, Exams, Education after High School, Volunteer/Work Experience, On-the-Job, Military, Helpful High School Courses),
- **Wages** (Wages in various states, locations, and pay periods, 10/25/50/75/90% of people make this wage or less) Median=50%. Many factors contribute to a person's wages, but entry-level positions generally fall between 10-25%, while those with more experience and education might expect to earn between 75%-90%. (U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2017)


**Job Duties**

**Task List**  
 The following list of occupational tasks is specific to Couriers and Messengers.

- Pick up, unload, and sort items collected on delivery routes.
- Obtain signatures and payment for items when they are delivered.
- Load vehicles with goods to be delivered, making sure items are packed correctly and carefully.
- Receive instructions for picking up items to be delivered. Plan the most efficient delivery route.
- Walk, ride bicycle, or drive to delivery destinations. Deliver items to recipients.
- Keep records of items received and delivered.
- Maintain bike or delivery vehicle.
- May perform routine office work, like sorting mail and answering telephones.
- Check in with home offices to confirm delivery.

**Common Work Activities**  
 Couriers and Messengers perform the following tasks. These tasks are common to many occupations.

- Get information needed to do the job
- Document and record information
- Operate vehicles or mechanized equipment
- Communicate with supervisors, peers, or subordinates
- Handle and move objects
- Establish and maintain relationships
- Identify objects, actions, and events
- Perform activities that use the whole body
- Monitor events, materials, and surroundings
- Evaluate information against standards




## Occupational Personality Types

Occupational Personality Types



Artistic - The "Creators"

People with Artistic Interests like work activities that deal with the artistic side of things, such as forms, designs and patterns. They like self-expression in their work. They prefer settings where work can be done without following a clear set of rules.

EXAMPLE CAREERS

Actors, Animators and Multimedia Artists, Architects



Conventional - The "Organizers"

People with Conventional interests like work activities that follow set procedures and routines. They prefer working with data and detail more than with ideas. They prefer work in which there are precise standards rather than work in which you have to judge things by yourself. These people like working where the lines of authority are clear.

EXAMPLE CAREERS

Accountants and Auditors, Actuaries, Archivists



Enterprising - The "Persuaders"

People with Enterprising Interests like work activities that have to do with starting up and carrying out projects, especially business ventures. They like persuading and leading people and making decisions. They like taking risks for profit. These people prefer action rather than thought.

EXAMPLE CAREERS

Administrative Services Managers, Advertising Managers, Advertising Salespeople



Investigative - The "Thinkers"

People with Investigative interests like work activities that have to do with ideas and thinking more than with physical activity. They like to search for facts and figure out problems mentally rather than to persuade or lead people.

EXAMPLE CAREERS

Aerospace Engineers, Agricultural Engineers, Agricultural Scientists



Realistic - The "Do-ers"

People with Realistic interests like work activities that include practical, hands-on problems and solutions. They enjoy dealing with plants, animals and real-world materials, like wood, tools and machinery. They enjoy outside work. Often people with Realistic interests do not like occupations that mainly involve doing paperwork or working closely with others.

EXAMPLE CAREERS

Agricultural Inspectors, Agricultural Products Graders and Sorters, Aircraft Mechanics



Social - The "Helpers"


People with Social interests like work activities that assist others and promote learning and personal development. They prefer to communicate more than to work with objects, machines or data. They like to teach, to give advice, to help or otherwise be of service to people.

EXAMPLE CAREERS

Acupuncturists, Addictions Counselors, Adult and Vocational Education Teachers

Each page lists careers that may suit a particular personality type well. Additionally, each career listing includes the **Cluster, Interest Areas, Pathway, and Personality Type**, as well as a notification of whether a video is available for it.
